Fred Bettess Commemorated

In addition to the support already given to the Alnmouth Local History Group, Fred's family has made a very generous bequest to the village in memory of their father. A fund will be set up for your Parish Council to use in supporting various projects, the first of which will be replacing the old information boards around the village and establishing a new one by the harbour. Fred contributed to the production of the original boards, as well as their replacements, and this latest one will be dedicated to the memory of our former Parish Council Chair, distinguished local historian and much loved resident.



War Memorial Re-dedicated



The re-dedication of the War Memorial, following its recent restoration, took place on Sunday, 6 April in a service conducted by the Rev Ian MacKarill. The restoration, undertaken by stonemasons Paul Foster & Co, was funded mainly by the proceeds of Alnmouth's Secret Gardens Day in 2012, helped by grants from the War Memorials Trust, Alnmouth Parish Council, the AONB Partnership and a generous anonymous donation. Very many thanks to all involved, but especially to Shian Hartshorn and Jack Ross, without whose efforts this regeneration of the War Memorial would not have been achieved.
